<p>Background</p> <p>Professor Gordon has spent the last 11 years Deloitte Tohmatsu partner focused on providing economic, financial, and international tax advice to multinational clients. His banking experience during the time leading up to and during the great financial crisis (2007 – 2008) provided him with a practical understanding of the interconnected nature of the global</p>
